GeoGuesser Rules

GeoGuesser Rules:

You will have 30 seconds to examine the images on each slide to determine the city being represented. You need to look at context clues to help narrow your choices.

Elementary and Intermediate Division: There are 25 questions divided into geographic regions. The answers are primary and secondary cities.

Upper Division: There are 30 questions but they are NOT divided into geographic regions and could be anywhere in the world. Context clues will help narrow your guesses.

1. The cities will cover six continents and each belong to a unique country, ranging in difficulty from global alpha cities to smaller provincial cities.
2. If the student gets the cities correct, they get no "miles" because the distance in miles between the city they guessed and the correct answer would be 0 miles. If the student gets the city wrong, then they are penalized with "miles".
3. Penalty for leaving an answer blank: Blank answers will be penalized with 12,000 miles. For the Elementary and Intermediate Division, you could receive up to 9710 for the Americas, 7880 for Asia, 5000 for Africa, 3320 for Oceania, and 3300 for Europe. For the Upper Division, 12,400 miles is the greatest distance between any two cities on earth.
4. The objective is to accumulate the fewest miles. Medals will be given out based on the student that has the least amount of miles to their name.
